Coach Dale Rominski

Dale Rominski played for Brother Rice High School, leading them to a state title over Pioneer in 1992. He received the coveted Mr. Hockey award his senior year. After high school, Dale played one year of junior hockey with the Compuware Ambassadors, and earned a scholarship for the University of Michigan in 1995. Coach Dale won two NCAA titles, one in 1996, the year of the famous lacrosse-style goal by Mike Legg, and the second in 1998. In 1999, Coach Dale's senior year, he served as assistant captain and led the nation in game-winning goals with eight.

Upon graduation, Dale signed with the NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning. Dale spent most of his professional career with Tampa Bay's minor league affiliate, the Detroit Vipers, but had the pleasure of playing 3 games with the Lightning recording one assist.

Since attaining his dream of playing in the NHL, Dale has served as head hockey coach of the Huron River Rats and the Greenhills Gryphons, as a counselor of the USA Developmental teams, and a volunteer at Mott Children's Hospital.

Currently, Dale is in his second year of his Masters of Social Work concentrating in interpersonal practice with children and youth. He is working in the Wayne-Westland school district practicing school social work at Wayne Memorial High School and Vandenberg Elementary.

Dale believes in creating a safe environment where children can learn hockey skills and explore the fun of hockey through play.
